# A Proposal for a Workshop on Hardware Dependability: Impact of Scaling and Energy

- Previous related Workshop quite some time ago already ...—> 2003 (Monterrey)
- Since then new challenges and opportunities ahead... (IRTS)
- Series of DSN-attached Workshops (Workshop on Dependable and Secure Nanocomputing) — Well-attended, core community-(re)building, very successful especially this year
- 7 Interest within DSN: DSN 2009 —> 9 papers on HW within DCCS
- Chicago appears to be the right central location ...

# ITRS\* Crosscutting Challenge 5: Reliability

Relaxing the requirement of 100% correctness for devices and interconnects may dramatically reduce costs of manufacturing, verification, and test.

Such a paradigm shift is likely forced in any case by technology scaling, which leads to more transient and permanent failures of signals, logic values, devices, and interconnects.

Several example issues are as follows. 1) Below 65nm, single-event upsets (soft errors) impact field-level product reliability, not only for embedded memories, but for logic and latches as well. 2) Methods for accelerated lifetime testing (burn-in) become infeasible as supply voltages decreas (resulting in exponentially longer burn-in times); even power demands of burn-in ovens become overwhelming. 3) Atomic-scale effects can demand new "soft" defect criteria, such as for non-catastrophic gate oxide breakdown. In general, automatic insertion of robustness into the design will become a priority as systems become too large to be functionally tested at manufacturing exit

Potential solutions include automatic introduction of redundant logic and on-chip reconfigurability for fault tolerance, development of adaptive and self-correcting or self-healing circuits, and software-based fault-tolerance.







# Motivation

- Systems are getting larger, more complex
- Industry is actively worrying about the ability to understand and analyze these systems
  - Most of all, to be able to determine the root-cause of failures in an accurate and timely manner
- Area: Involves multiple disciplines: Dependability +
  - Machine learning, data mining, signal-analysis, compiler theory, systems, performance analysis, .....
- Chicago will attract both European and US industry speakers

# Purpose of Workshop

- Bring together industry & academic researchers
  - Bring in machine-learning researchers
  - Bring in data-center operators

  - And, then, us dependability researchers

# Why Now?

- SOSP, OSDI, NSDI, Sigmetrics all these venues are making data/ failure analysis & diagnosis a top priority
- The industry community is targeting its efforts/attendance/data at these other conferences
  - OSDI papers on diagnosis in real data centers
  - SOSP paper on work on diagnosis in eBay system
  - SOSP papers on diagnosis for Microsoft's email systems
  - Sigmetrics paper on diagnosis in corporate networks
- But ..... this work started at DSN years ago!
  - Many people in our community care about & work in this area
  - Want to see DSN become the hub for this topic
- We have a chance to impact production systems if we get industry's attention and show our renewed interest in this area

# What Will We Get Out of It?

- Articulation of research challenges in this space
- Understanding of current state-of-the-art (industry & academic) and what is lacking
- Connections with industries that have real data-sets of interest to us
- Case studies from industries with real-world problems in this area
