Background

- 71st IFIP Working Group Meeting Proposal
 - Following Takashi's recommendation to consider societal systems
 - Sami proposed Fake News as a societal problem
 - Proposal accepted
- United States Presidential Election
 - Russian disinformation and attempts to influence outcome
 - Accusations of possible active Russian Collusion
 - Lack of means to decide if disinformation changed the results
 - Lack of ability to assess level of Vulnerability
- Russian Attempts to Influence French Elections

Some Definitions

- **Misinformation**—unintentionally incorrect information
- **Disinformation**—intentionally incorrect information as part of deception
- **Deception**—actions (including spreading disinformation) taken to intentionally mislead
- **Information warfare**—use of information and information technology to gain an advantage (includes deception)
- **Psychological Operations (PsyOps)**—action by psychological methods to cause a planned psychological reaction
- **Influence operations**—coordinated effort to alter target's attitudes, decisions and behaviors toward influencers interests

- Set the Stage to Explore Solutions
- **Workshop** In Which We Advance Understand

Goals

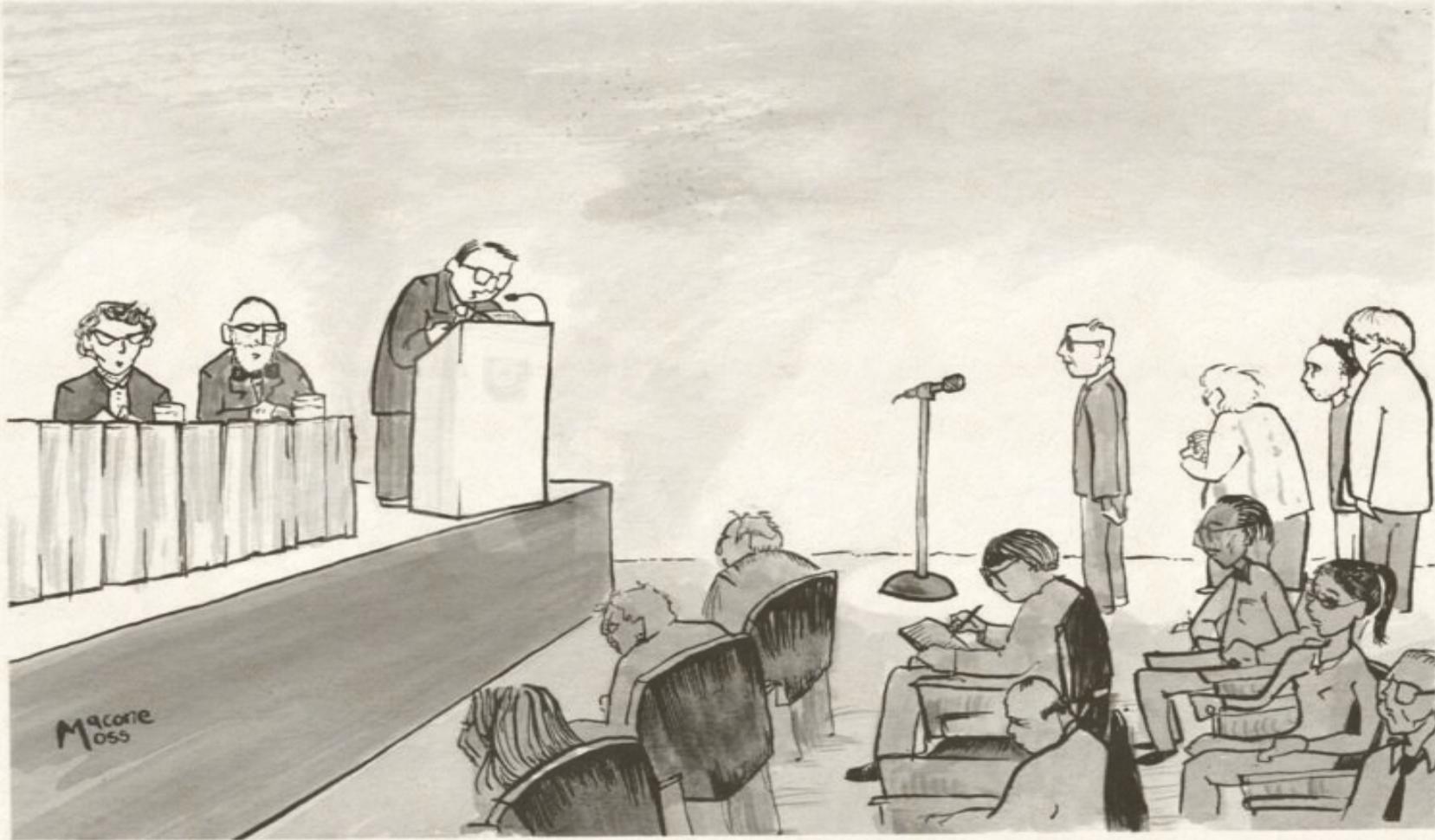
- Develop a clear problem statement
- Understand nature of the problem and nuances
- Identify causes of problem and what has changed
 - Understand the role of social media beyond the superficial “echo chamber”
- Identify constraints on solution space

Rules

- Participate heavily
- Diversity of opinion is welcome and embraced
- Civility in discussion, without exception
- Clarity and logic in disagreements
- Seeking ideas from the entire group, not just the vocal few
- Speakers are provocateurs of conversation, not lecturers
- Unpolished draft ideas are fine
- Broaden view of systems beyond technology
 - Embrace guests from other disciplines

- What is the system here and what are the faults, errors, and failures
- How can the dependability community add insight
- Can and should the dependability community extend its definition of system to include broader societal systems and how should IFIP 10.4 change to accommodate (e.g. include sociologists and psychologists?)
